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PATRÓN LUNARES

Miguel Bonet Oliver, embarked at a young age on fishing boats, he was one of the best and youngest trawler captains of Mallorca. In the days when there was a lack of current technology, Patrón Lunares followed coastal landmarks; used ropes, mountains and even buildings...

He shared this valuable information with the young captains that began in the art of fishing. Friends of his friends and iconic in Santa Catalina, his neighbourhood; on the days that he could not go out fishing, he got together with friends at a bar in San Magin to play his favourite pastimes, the Truc (card game). The children went to meet and greet him, a gesture that he always gratified with a few pesetas. Good and honest man, non-drinker and heavy smoker until his death.

THE TRAMWAY



The history of the first regular public passenger service takes us back to 1891, when Palma City Council was asked to grant a concession for a 4.4 km tram. To communicate Palma (from Pza. De Coll with Porto Pi). Twelve flower boxes manufactured by the Zaragoza company Cardé & Slag and fittings were hired in Liverpool. These planters were dragged by mules that came to form a block of 28 mules. On September 20 of that year the first tramway line was opened, between Plaza de'n Coll and Porto Pi, at that time with animal traction and a mobile park composed of 9 planters, which later increased to 12. The operating company Of the service was the Mallorcan Society of Trams, which would continue the service until 1914.

Among its objectives was the extension of the tram service to other neighborhoods of Palma, but for various reasons the expansion never took place. In 1914 the General Society of Intercity Trams of Palma was established after the absorption of the previous company, based on the concession of 1910 obtained by the Count of Ayamans, transferred to this society.

THE OLD SIGNAL LIGHTHOUSE PORTO PÍ

In the past, the cove of Porto Pi was a safe haven for boats, sheltered from storms and deep water. The two towers rising on either side of its mouth, played an important role before the port extensions, and proof of this are the privileges, ordinations and decrees issued by the authorities throughout its history. The origin of these towers of these towers is uncertain. It is speculated that they already existed in times of the Romans, and at their base have been found archaeological remains that seem to confirm these hypotheses. Moreover, among the facilities of the same typology, the Mallorcan tower is the third oldest in the world in operation after the Tower of Hercules (La Coruña) and the Lantern of Genoa.

In antiquity, as some engravings show, there were four towers. These were the Chain, the Signals, the Peraires and the one near San Nicolaet. In the Middle Ages it was customary to close the port with a chain stretched between both towers so that no boat could enter or leave the port.

LA AEROMARÍTIMA MALLORQUÍNA

The first air-mail Barcelona - Palma

At the beginning of the 20's of the last century, the uncoordinated schedules between the trains and the mail ships of the Islandía Marítima, made the mail between Barcelona and Palma arrive with much more delay to the destination than due to the time of navigation and The operations of ships. Before, at the beginning of 1.914 the Association of Mediterranean Shipowners had been formed. Its most prominent project in 1920 was to operate with hydrofoils Savoia S-9, a postal service linking the two capitals, 195 km of route, departing from Barcelona at 9:30 am, in connection with the fast mail from Madrid and Arriving in Palma in just over an hour. Finally, on March 18, 1920, after a triumphal exit from the port of Barcelona, at 11:30 the hydroplane driven by Guido Janello (who was a lieutenant of the Royal Italian Navy) set sail for Mallorca. He took as a passenger the Chief Engineer of Hereter Workshops, Jorge Loring and the journalist and director of the Union of Sports Journalists, José M^o Co de Triola.

The enthusiasm in Palma was apothecic. A large crowd had invaded the wharf and nearby areas eager to witness the arrival of the famous hydro with its passengers, which really marked a milestone in the history of communications with the peninsula. The hydro after a spectacular pass over the port of Palma, settled calmly on its waters. It was 12'43; The crossing had been covered in one hour and thirteen minutes. Faced with the enthusiasm of the whole of Palma, the hydro was anchored in a buoy despite the difficulties caused by the large number of boats eager to see and greet the intrepid aviators. Once disembarked, pilot and crew were received by the authorities to which Janello and passengers delivered the greeting messages of those who were porters of the authorities and press of Barcelona. After the official reception by the mayor of Palma, in the name of the city, they were taken to the Mallorquín Circle - not far from the port - where they ate and could rest for a while. There they received new messages of greeting and affection for the authorities and press of Barcelona. (Extracted from: EAM)

PATRÓN ILLUSTRIOUS CHARACTERS



OLIVER SANDBERG

He was born in Denmark in 1908. Educated by his grandparents and studying industrial engineering and exercising as such, he was the first entrepreneur to install central heating in Denmark. From a Danish noble family he recovered a title that belonged to his family, but was lost by the death of his father 2 months before he was born. A great sportsman and ice skating champion, until an accident in the mid-30s during the 5 years of the Nazi occupation of Denmark. He was very active in the resistance, he created several sabotage groups and was caught on two occasions by the Gestapo, the first time he escaped from jail but the second time he was tortured and had his grandson shot before him to make him confess and betray his fellows of resistance colleagues - he didn't and he was imprisoned until Capitulation of Germany in May 1945. After the war he returned to his career as an entrepreneur and his investment business in addition to being part of NATO by Denmark.

He was a great traveller and in Majorca spent long periods in his property in Capdellá. Where he lived until his death in 1979.

CATALINEROS AROUND THE WORLD

When fishermen embarked, they did it on llauts and "barques de bou". Routes in the Eastern regions, the Cantabrian ports, the North Sea, Africa, France and America were covered by crews composed entirely of catalineros neighbors.

The early 1900s trips to Cuba, Puerto Rico, to Montevideo covered a route from Palma to Barcelona and then to America to transport people and goods. While the population in Palma was stationary, the the catalineros sailed regularly to Cuba -mostly as a need-. Many of them returned with money to establish businesses and factories.

THE HISTORY OF EL MONTEPIO DEL ARRABAL

The El Montepío del Arrabal has been an emblem of the neighborhood. We would like to pay a tribute to this iconic association.

The cantine, Patrón Lunares, located at number 30 of Calle de la Fábrica, has an important history in the life of the neighborhood of Santa Catalina and of Palma. For 115 years this emblematic site was the headquarters and meeting place of the Provident Society of Montepío de Previsión del Arrabal.

The Montepío was born in 1894 with the goal of providing health care to its members, who were mostly fishermen, workers, shoemakers and rope makers.

As today's Social Security, the Montepío provided its members with a doctor, a midwife, a practitioner and even a burial.
